PRESIDENTS REPORT JULY 2020

I hope this report finds all our club members and their families safe and well as most if not all of us are in lockdown once again for a further 6 weeks as this extremely infective virus has resurfaced and is threatening us once again. Since my last report a number of things have happened which affect the club activities.

We have been notified that the Fly-in has been cancelled but that the Fly-in committee is in good shape and financially sound and subject to the ongoing situation the event will be held next year from Friday the 8th to Sunday the 10th October 2021 The committee has decided that it is most unlikely that sufficient Covid19 restrictions will be lifted by September to enable the Community events including the Kid's day and Scope day to be held and the events for this year have been cancelled.

Bunning's have cancelled all our fundraising BBQ's until further notice so all of our planned future internal and external club fund raising for this year will not happen. Regardless of this the club is in a sound financial position and also in the position to immediatly recommence activities when allowed.



Fly of the Month Muddler Minnow

Unquestionably the most famous of all streamers, designed by Don Galen and the model for many others.



Hook: 3x long size10-4

Thread: 6/0 (waxed) Tan, Brown or Black.

Tail: Mottled Turkey Body: Flat Gold Tinsel Rib: Copper Wire

Underwing: Grey Squirrel Tail

Wing: Mottled Turkey Head: Natural Deer Hair


The idea of spinning Deer Hair to form a voluminous head is attributed to Don Gapen of Anoka, Minnesota in the US, and the original Muddler Minnow was tied by him back in 1937 specially developed to catch brook trout in Ontario, Canada.

The original Muddler fly has spawned a large number of variations that all have the clipped deer hair head. It is now used all around the world. The head is tied with natural deer hair and then clipped into shape. The Buoyant deer hair keeps the Muddler off the bottom, so it can be fished at all depths. The deer hair is hollow and the trapped air makes it buoyant. The muddler flies can be fished as a wake fly when the weather is dull which is usually late in the season when the sedges can be seen skating on the surface.


Stripping a Muddler across the waves can induce tremendous takes from trout which will follow it for yards. Tied in natural colours this type of pattern can prove effective. With a sinking line its buoyancy adds life to the fly.

Library Book Of The Month



There is nothing more gloriously mysterious "says David Scholes, "than Fly Fishing." Yet most Fly Fishermen, after only a few years at the game, are tempted to speak with considerable authority. This is a grevous mistake (except perhaps for the fish!), for there will come a daywhen, in a remarkably short time, some quite positive conviction is either woefuffy shakenor completely shattered.

Once the angler is past this stage, his fishing really begins; but even then it is wise not to be too dogmatic. The fishing discussed in this bookcovers the author's own angling experience from quite soon after commencement until the season just ended. He has chosen to tell this by a series of reminiscences and discoveries which, by their own nature, should prove of interest and general appeal not only to those who are just beginning with the rod, but also to seasoned veterans. He relates events as they happened, first in the streams of Victoria, then breifly in America and Great Britain, next aamongst the rivers and lakes of Tasmania, and finally in the Snowy Mountains area of New South Wales.
