Just a quick reminder for all the members who have not paid their memberships they are well and truly overdue.


For those who ordered new Club shirts and caps will be available at the clubrooms on Wednesday night, there are a few spares for members who missed the order so first in.

A few weeks ago on a Christmas visit to my daughter who lives nearby, I had occasion to visit the Tackle shop once again. While waiting for my business to be attended to I perused the photo's on the walls of the shop. Many of them featured local catches both recent and from the past.

Some of the latter were of **Lionel Sweet** the original owner of Sweets Tackle Shop. It is obvious from the photos that Lionel was a trout and salmon 'fisho' from an early age, took great delight in passing on his expertise to others (at the Usk and royal Agricultural society Shows) and was a bit of a com-

ic as well. Look at him skylarking in the 'photo below!

Behind the counter Jean, who worked for Lionel and

now owns the shop spends her days tying flies as well as selling other fishing tackle, reels, lines and rods etc. My business with her was to have a broken section of my



fly-rod replaced. This Jean accomplished in super quick time, despite manufacturers etc having reduced opening

hours over Christmas.

some of our local streams when the weather gives way to the cooler days of autumn!

BC's Tassie Trip 2019

My short trip to Tasmania for 2019 started with the flight to Launceston on 10 January and being picked up by Christine and Peter Hill, then the car ride up to Arthurs Lake. Always a great feeling seeing the pipeline coming from Poatina down the escarpment.

The first day saw Peter and myself on Penstock Lagoon with a northerly wind and rough water. After three hours of buffeting we decide to call it a day.



Saturday saw us on Arthurs Lake and we made our way to Creely Bay. Conditions were good in the bay but mayflies and beetles were very few with no fish rising.

Sunday was back to Penstock with vastly improved conditions. Duns and spinners were hatching consistently providing food for quite a few trout to be rising. I landed a 45cm Brown Trout taken on a parachute adams, and later a 50cm Rainbow on a Charles Peck dun pattern. (We tried many flies to get a take).

Monday we tried Woods Lake. Hardly saw a fish, let alone many duns.

Tuesday was going to be a lay day, but after lunch, under very stormy conditions, we headed to Woods Lake quite cautiously. Thunder storms were prevalent (little did we know that dry lightning strikes from these storms were going to start the Great Pine Tier Central Plateau bushfire). There was the occasional dun popping up, with the very occasional fish chasing them.



We were doing a drift on a foam line when Peter landed a 54cm very fine Brown Trout. That was all the action. After a while we headed home, and after loading the boat on the trailer, the wind dropped out and fish started to rise. Bugger!!!

Wednesday and conditions on Arthurs Lake were excellent. We put in at the dam wall and headed up the Sand Lake, fishing some of the bays - Flemings Bay, Jones Bay and Sevenpound Bay. We finally got to our destination of the Cowpaddock. Conditions were perfect, with the breeze chopping about but didn't worry us. Peter landed a beautiful 56cm (4lb) Brown with his Fred fly, fishing the gaps in



the weeds. He then landed a 42cm Brown using the same principle. He offered me a Fred Fly (made from his chocolate Labrador) to which I accepted. I was just a spectator up to this point, my only activity netting Peter's fish and having knot tying practice changing flies. First cast with the Freddy fly and landed a pan sized Brown. Very nice way to finish my fishing. We headed back home - a reasonable trip considering we circumnavigated the lake.

Thursday and back to the heat of

Albury/Wodonga.

We had no idea of the size the Great Pine Tier Central Plateau bushfire would get to (even now the beast is growing). My daily (several times) ritual is to check the Tasmania Fire Service site to check the position of the fire and to make sure Christine and Peter, Doug and Liz and Kath and others I (we) know are safe from fires harm.


Greenwells A Review - the latest addition to our club library


For weeks, bushfires have been ravaging Tasmania.

Almost every day more warnings spring up, new areas are on alert.

New fires sprung up across the state, notably on the Central Plateau, and in the south near the Tahune forest.

"There are multiple major fire events occurring simultaneously, which is extremely challenging for firefighters and fire managers because of the requirement to spread resources and make very difficult prioritising decisions."

On January 20, the Central Plateau fire burning near Great Lake was already showing its might.



Aggressive and ready to strike, it claimed one property — the Skittle Ball Plains Homestead, a fishing retreat — on January 22.



By January 28 it seemed to have grown in every direction, destroying the wilderness around it.

Many roads are still closed with some open to bona fide local residents.

We have many members and friends living and visiting the area at the moment and hope they all keep safe.

Skittle Balls Plains Homestead Lost

A house at Skittle Ball Plains near Miena was lost to fire just before 7pm last night. The owners had a plan to stay and defend their property with the assistance of fire crews.

They had a clear space around their property, a fire pump and sprinklers on the roof.

Fire crews and the owners were defending the property from bushfire when conditions became untenable and required everyone to evacuate. Thankfully everyone involved is safe.

This photo clearly shows an unburnt area and green trees around the house, which indicates the house came under ember attack, rather than a direct impact from the nearby Central Plateau fire.



Not even seemingly defendable properties are defendable in the conditions we are facing.

Know your risk. Make a plan.






