Sat 4th April, Sat 4th July and Sat 3rd October


Community days for Scope and Kids day are Friday 18th, 19th and 20th of September are also days to put in your calendar

Fly of the Month



Quigley Cripple

Hook: Standard dry, or light wire scud style, size 12-16.

Thread: To match natural, size 6 or 8.

Tail:Marabou fibres, to match natural nymph colour.

Rib:Fine gold or copper wire.

Abdomen: Marabou butts from tail, twisted into a rope and wrapped forward.

Thorax: Dubbing to match natural dun colour.

Wing:Dark deer hair, tied tips forward, butts trimmed over thorax.

Hackle: Dry fly hackle colour to match the natural, wrapped sparsely.



Cripples represent mayflies that are just emerging or got stuck in it's shuck. Bob Quigley came up with this pattern in 1978 while he was fishing Fall River in Northern California.

Bob's Cripple patterns are distinguished with a forward Wing, usually of Deer or Elk Hair, extending over the eye of the hook and the butt of the wing trimmed in line with a dubbed thorax to represent an emerging dun. The rear portion of tail, usually Marabou tips, and abdomen is tied to represent the trailing shuck as the mayfly has pulled free from it's nymphal body. The intent is to have the top half of the fly reside above water while the bottom half hangs within the water column. Initially, Bob tied this pattern to a standard Dry Fly hook such as a TMC 100 or 101. However, curved hooks such as a TMC 2312 or 2302 were used to give the fly a more natural posture.
