The first General Meeting for 2020 was a great success with guide Scott Xanthoulakis providing a great insight into the art of midge fishing. I am sure the catch rate of fish feeding on midge for all members who attended will greatly improve.

The suggested May trip to Millbrook was quickly filled and for all those who missed out a second trip will be organised later in the year and those who missed out will be given first preference to register for the second trip.

We will be having a meeting with two Councillors about the proposed extension to the clubroom prior to the March General Meeting with preliminary advice being that they support our proposal to extend the clubroom so it is not dead yet.

Club Room extension – Lynton still following up with Council.



Dave Jenkins Day - Noojee Trip Reports

Chris Redfern Caught 3 and dropped 2 on the Toorongo River. Walked down stream from the 2^{nd} Bridge for 15 min and fished back up which gave him about 1.5 - 2hrs fishing.

All about 20-22 cm caught on a Size #16 Gold Bead Head 30cm under a Royal Wulff Indicator all in the Slower Water.



Noojee Club Trip By Darren Samphier

Being a very new member this was my first club trip. And only my second fly fishing outing – although the first was on my own where I realised I don't know how to fly fish.

I told Paul Pavone I was going and he offered to take me under his wing for the day and show me where to go and what to do.

We started by walking the Latrobe downstream from the barbecue park. That's when I realised casting in the river is so much different from casting in the backyard. Paul showed me a roll cast and that kept my fly out of the trees a little but there weren't any fish seen. We wandered along a little further and then went up the Loch. This is where Paul caught his first for the day. A nice little brown about 25cm.



A little further on I saw a trout rise and tried for it with an Elk Hair Caddis. It wasn't taking it and Paul suggested swapping out for a Hairy Red Tag. I landed red tag near the rise about 5 times. However, each of these were in the trees above the river. I finally got one in the water and the trout took it. I was far too slow and had far too much slack in the line to set the hook and the Red Tag was spat out. Still, it was the closest I'd ever come so I was pretty happy.

Back to the Barbecues for lunch and a chat and then we headed out to the Torongo. We headed downstream and at one part of the river Paul was going to show me how to drift the fly down stream. The lesson was interrupted immediately as a trout took the fly as soon as it hit the water. Another Brown, bigger than the first, at 28cm.



We headed down further and then started fishing our way back. At one part Paul told me to put the fly near the opposite edge using an Parachute Adams. I cast fairly close to the bank and a nice little brown trout took the fly and I managed to keep him on while Paul got him in the net. Unfortunately, Paul jammed his rod into a rock as he was getting the net ready and broke off the tip.



I had a great day catching my first trout ever and watching Paul pull in a couple more. Thanks to Paul who showed a great deal of patience with the newbie.

Fly of the Month



Hare and Copper nymph

The Hare & Copper is a favourite NZ and Australian pattern and is one of my favourite flys. Fished unweighted, beaded or lightly weighted it is versatile and effective. It is a very simple fly to tie, it always swims right as it doesn't have a wing case and it represents a large number of different food sources.

Hook Kamasan B175 #10 to #18

Bead Optional Copper coloured bead, weighed to suit.

Thread Black Uni 6/0

Tail Cock Pheasant Tail


Ribbing Copper Wire

Dubbing Hares mask under fur and guard hairs.

The reason the Hare & Copper is such an effective fly is it suggests food to trout. It may not represent anything perfectly but it may represent a water boatmen, a mayfly nymph, a Mayfly Emerger, a Caddis Nymph and a few other thing. It's small brown and hairy and more importantly most trout see it and think "Food". Fur from the cheeks of the hares mask can be trimmed, shaved or torn to make the dubbing that gives this fly the movement and shape that trout find irresistible. Fished under an indicator or dry fly, on the bottom or just in the meniscus, this nymph will catch fish!
