Presidents report:

I would like to welcome you all to the 2019 AGM where obviously we all as club members have to make some important decisions as to our involvement and the future of the club.

As I have continually stated in my reports to the General Meetings and in the page in the Fly Line, we need more members volunteering to help run the club and some new faces on the committee and the AGM is where each of you can make this happen in a small or large way.

To the outgoing Executive Committee members Paul Pavone, Owen Lloyd, Ray Malins even though overloaded you have done a great job in ensuring the club, for the last year, has been a success and a special thanks to Doug Braham for staying on and assisting Ray and Paul in their new roles as Treasurer and Secretary. I very much appreciate the strong and reliable support and help from each of you throughout the year.

A big thanks also to the unseen helpers who work away in the background at club meetings, club events, club activities and BBQ's where every bit of help however small helps to make the club a success.

The aim of the committee for the year was to consolidate the position of the club, ensure the core activities were successful, media was functioning properly and restrict spending until a comprehensive budget was prepared to enable the committee to see the true cost of running the club. All of which have been achieved.

Following the preparation of the budget it became clear that we needed to recover the costs of increasing insurance premiums and affiliations with membership of other fishing associations and media.

As a result the committee voted to institute a levy for \$20.00 to cover these costs. It was also voted to maintain the existing membership fee of \$80.00 and this year to reinstate the joining fee for new members. It is noted that the membership fee has not been increased for several years.

The \$50.00 joining fee is an investment in the club by new members and helps the club to invest in updating casting equipment such as rods reels and lines, fly tying equipment and the library by purchasing the latest books and DVD's which can exceed \$1000.00 each year, for the benefit and use of new and existing members.

We have made more progress with documenting the roles and responsibilities of executive committee members and portfolio subcommittees for guidance for future committees with Marketing, Membership and Club Activities now complete. However there is still more to be done in the coming year.

It is important we keep up with the latest trends in media and technology and the Media portfolio has been revitalised with Evin Stephens updating Face Book, renewing our Meet Up subscription with the site, Ross Hancock updating the website and Owen Lloyd producing a fantastic club magazine with all of the above resulting in an increased interest in the club and several new members. Thanks for a great job.

I am proposing to the new committee that the AGM be moved to the month of June as it is now out of sync with the financial year ending June the 30th which results in a large number of members who sometimes take a while to pay fees not being financial and with a June date all members will be financial at the AGM.

I do not like singling people out but once again a special thanks to Kaye and Barry Tresize who have continued to provide supper at our monthly meetings and are some of the people helping in the background I referred to previously.

Following discussions with the Yarra Ranges Council a revised application for a grant of \$50000.00 has been submitted to the council. At the request of the council a Town Planning application has also been submitted. Applications close on the 12th of August and will be reviewed by the council by the 31st of October 2019 when successful applicants will be advised

If our application is successful then the proposal to extend the clubroom will be put to the coming November General Meeting for members approval. Construction would be expected to commence by January 2020.

It is a privilege to serve the club in the role of president or any other position. I would like to thank all the members for the ideas and vision for the club expressed to me over the year and the support I have received during the past year and hope this input continues as the club must change with the times to continue to be successful.

To the incoming Executive Committee as the outgoing committee we leave the club in a well organised and sound financial position which should enable the club to continue its success and I wish the new committee a productive and successful year.

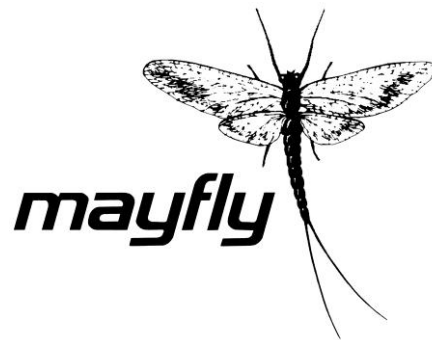

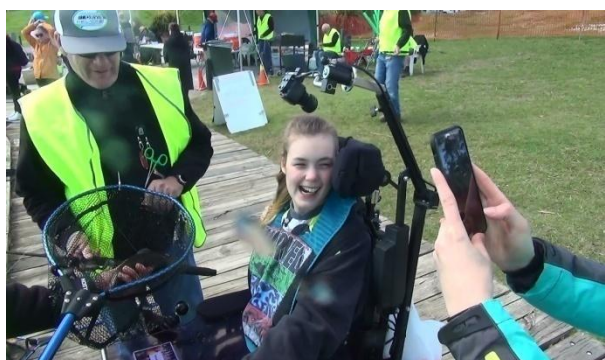

1. The Fly-In Committee shall not be held responsible for any damage to persons or property whilst attending the Fly-In.
2. The Fly-In is to be held on the second full weekend of October each year.
3. Registration of participants closes 11am **Saturday** 12th October
4. To be eligible for the various trophies, all fishing will be conducted between the hours of 6pm Friday to 11am Sunday. Any fish found to be caught outside these hours shall be disqualified. All proof of fish must be time stamped before 11.00am Sunday and presented to the committee by SMS or in person by 11:10 am
5. All trout must be a minimum 30cm in length to be eligible for prizes.
6. All competitors must hold a current Victorian Fishing Licence if required to do so.
7. Fish are to be photographed on the supplied truth mat **with the current Lake Fyans entry badge** and must be caught on a Fly to be eligible for Open trophies
8. Ladies and Juniors may measure any fish species of legal size caught by legal means.
9. The Fly-In Committee shall resolve any competition disputes with all parties concerned. The Committee decision shall be final.
10. Fishing will only be at Lake Fyans, Lake Bellfield, Lake Wartook and Green Hill Lake.
11. In the event of two fish being the same length, the winning fish will be the fish in the photograph with the earlier time stamp.

The CVFFC held a meeting at Ballarat Flyfishing Club on the 20th July 2019. The following details cover some of the areas discussed:-

1. *Impact of proposed logging in Snobs Creek catchment. VicForests Submission.*
CVFFC again discussed the affect of water quality due to the proposed logging and the possible impact on the Snobs Creek Hatchery. The members who attended the CVFFC meeting in Ballarat proposed that we write to VFA and the Minister regarding our concerns.
2. *CVFFC Fish Stocking Register for VFA submission in 2019*
VRFish sent a request to CVFFC to provide a collated request sheet of all our members to VFA Stocking meetings before the end of September 2019. Stocked or underperforming lakes should also be included. Members asked to forward stocking requests to CVFFC secretary or direct to VFA.
3. *Update on Carp Virus.*
VFA have indicated that all information is being collated and hopefully will be available at the end of 2019. It has been reported that Federal Government have also asked for more detail. Discussion appears to be ongoing and once finalised still needs government approval. This may take some time yet.
4. *VRFish Membership Model*
Information has been emailed to all clubs/delegates regarding club and individual membership. An official launch of their new membership model in the coming weeks, but indicated that clubs and individuals are welcome to sign up as of now.
5. *Fishing access / black spot issues - notification.*
The CVFFC have asked its members to provide information of any areas where access is an issue. This information will then be forwarded to VRFish.
6. *Recreational Fishing Licence Review 2019*
A review of the Recreational Fishing Licence and the Trust Account was requested by the Minister from the VFA by the end of 2019. CVFFC are planning on preparing a submission and are waiting for feedback from members.

This New Zealand pattern makes a great representation of something trout will eat in either lakes or streams, from small fish, dragon fly nymphs or even a small Cray. Designed to be fished deep with lead under chinelle, the overlaying cock ring neck rump feathers sometimes known as church window feathers fixed to the sides of the hook this fly is a perennial favourite. Best fished around weed beds and over drop offs.

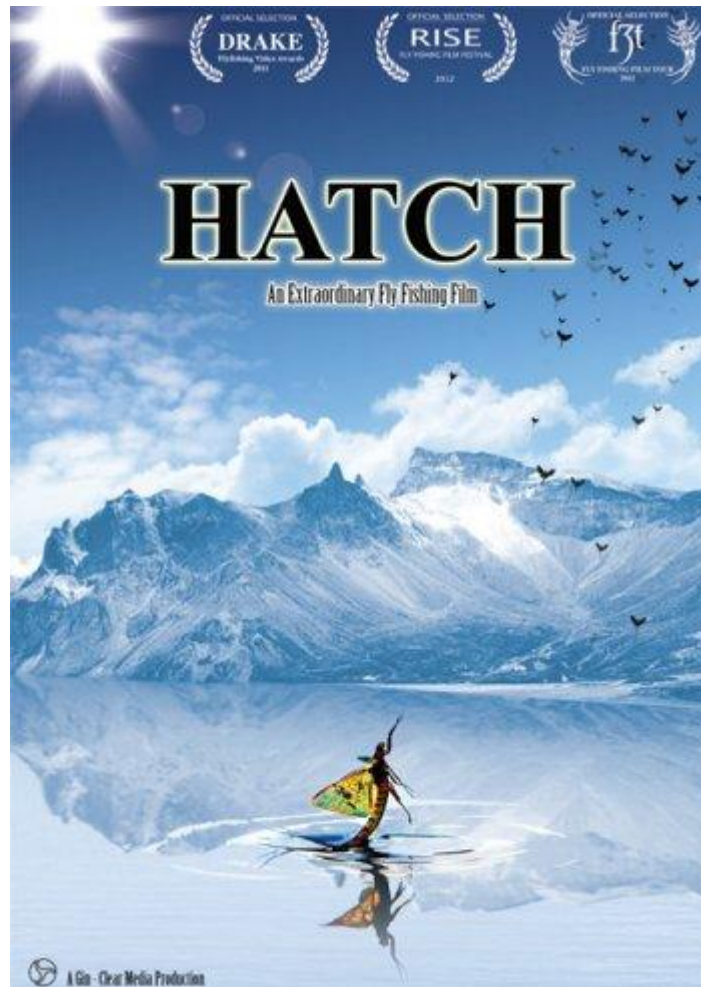
Recipe / Materials List

- Hook: 1xl to 2xl Nymph/Wet Sizes 2 to 12
- Weight: Round Lead Wire or Lead-Free Sub
- Thread: 6/0 black
- Tail: black or natural squirrel tail hair
- Body: Red Chinelle
- Wing: cock ring necked pheasant rump feathers

DVD Of The Month

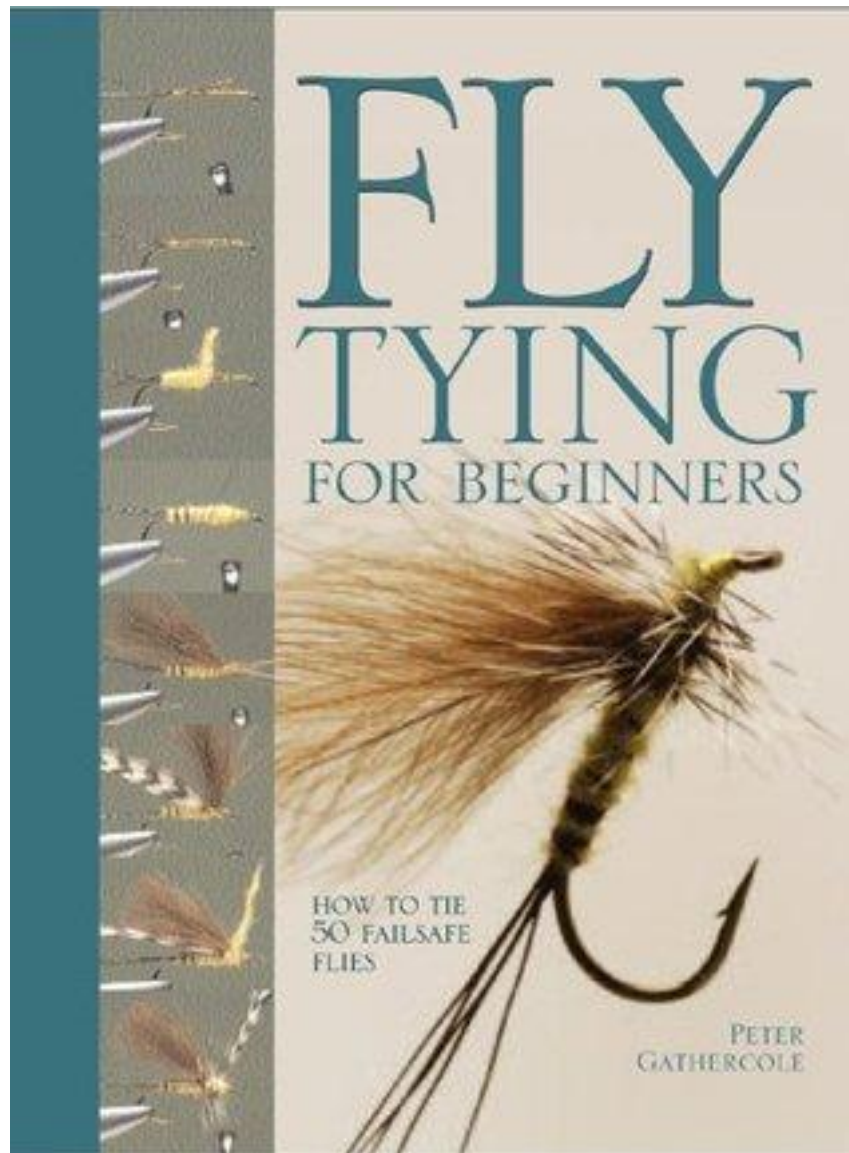


HATCH documents the world's most extraordinary insect hatches and the fantastic fly fishing that accompanies them.
